The Details of Schemes implemented by DRDA

1. Indira Aawas Yojana (IAY)

The Government of India is implementing Indira Aawas Yojana since the year 1985-86 with the objective of providing assistance to the Below Poverty Line (BPL) rural households belonging to SC/ST and free bonded labour categories. From the year 1993-94 its scope has been extended to cover non-scheduled castes and Scheduled tribes BPL rural poor. Under IAY scheme, assistance of Rs. 70,000/- is given for construction of New Houses and Rs. 15,000/- is given to upgrade the house to the BPL families which is shared between Central and State Government at the ratio of 60:40 respectively. In addition to this, the Government of Goa is giving additional assistance of Rs. 25,000/- for new construction. The vision is to provide houses to all by 2022.

2. National Family Benefit Scheme (NFBS)

Under this Scheme one time assistance of Rs. 20,000/- is provided to the BPL family on the death of bread winner as an instant relief from the Government. The earlier proposals in this respect were processed at Block Level and submitted to DRDA for sanction of assistance. However, in order to provide the instant relief the funds are placed at the disposal of BDO and the BDOs is authorized to provide the assistance to the applicant. This Scheme is 100% funded by Central Government.

3. Indira Gandhi National Old Age Pension Scheme (NOAPS)

This Scheme is transferred to the Social Welfare Department

4. Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY)

This Scheme is transferred to the Public Works Department.

5. Goa Gram Samrudhi Yojana (GGSY)

The Scheme provides creation of infrastructure assets in the rural areas like

- a) Construction of Panchayat Ghar
- b) Construction of Community hall
- c) Construction of play ground
- d) Construction of market complex

- e) Construction of drama stage
- f) Construction of protection wall
- g) Development of open space
- h) Fish Market.

This Scheme is 100% funded by the State Government.

Under the Scheme prescribed limit of each work upto Rs. 25 lakhs and Rs. 100 lakhs in special case with prior approval of the finance department.

6. Goa Grameen Urja Yojana (GGUY)

The objective of the scheme is to provide to all Below Poverty Line families installation of Domestic one new LPG connection, pollution free (Fuel) to minimize the use of firewood, thus decreasing the pressure on forest and at the same time helping in maintaining pollution free environment. The BPL families are provided with free LPG installation comprising of one gas stove with two burners and two cylinders for a total cost of Rs. 6087/-. This Scheme is 100% funded by the State Government.

7. Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA):

The Scheme provides 100 days of guaranteed unskilled wage employment in a financial year to every household in plain area and 150 days of job in forest dwelling area @ Rs. 208/- per day.

Kinds of Work:

- Construction of Kaccha Road/footpath, desilting/ development of nallah, desilting/ construction/ repair of tali/pond, cleaning of water logged areas, construction of well for community/SC purpose, land development of fellow land for agriculture purpose, repair of field bandh, repair of terraces, desilting of water channels **repair of pat**, repair of rubble wall with mud, construction of protection wall, leveling of land for development, construction of field bandh, excavation of existing water channel alongside paddy field.

This Scheme is a Centrally Sponsored Scheme which is shared between Central and State at the ratio of 90:10.

8. National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM)

The aim of the NRLM is to reduce poverty through building strong grassroots institutions of the poor. These institutions enable the poor households to access gainful self-employment and skilled wage employment opportunities, resulting in appreciable increase in their incomes, on a sustainable basis. NRLM is a Centrally Sponsored Scheme and the financing of the programme will be shared between the Centre and the State in the ratio of 60:40.

Goa State Rural Livelihood Mission has been constituted and registered under Societies Registration Act, 1860. The scheme was launched in Goa on 19th December 2015. Annual Action Plan for the financial year 2015-16 have been formulated and presented before Hon'ble C.M., Chief Secretary and Secretary (RD). For intensive purpose work is already started in Ibrampur Village in Pernem Taluka. The said scheme is introduced in place of Swarnajayanti Gram Swarozgar Yojana (SGSY). Both Executive body and Governing body have been formed

The objective of the Mission is as follows:-

- Poverty alleviation through women by forming their groups.
- Create income security for the rural poor through interventions at various levels.
- Increase participation of women in Panchayat Raj Institution (PRI) by empowering them through the means of Self Help Groups (SHG).
- Bring synergy for coordination and communication among different poverty alleviation programs of State and Central Government.
- Facilitating formation of federations at Village, Taluka/Block & District level.
- Facilitating access to financial institution for SHGS.
- To work with vulnerable and destitute people for their empowerment & upliftment.
